Write a selection of sentences that contain words with apostrophes for possession, e.g. Barry, my sister's rabbit, was grey and white.	Create your own game. Teach someone how to play it and enjoy! This could be a board game, physical game etc.
Practise times tables on TTRS for 10 minutes on at least three days a week.	Draw a picture of yourself: decorate using words that describe your character strengths and what qualities you have which make you a good friend	Follow a recipe to bake something. Are the changes to the ingredients reversible or irreversible?	Think of a way to help out at home that you don't normally do, e.g. keeping bedroom tidy, helping with washing up, vacuuming. Try to complete it every day.
